**WHEREAS**, Yakima Valley Libraries adopted a Video Access Policy December 23, 1997;


**WHEREAS**, the policy incorporates media, technology, and procedures that are no longer relevant to library services;



**WHEREAS**, the Trustees create and rescind all Library Policy,



## **VIDEO ACCESS**

---

### **PURPOSE**

The video access policy is to establish guidelines for library customer access to the video collection.

### **POLICIES**

Any library customer with a valid borrower's card may check out videos.

Library customers' use of the video collection will be managed fairly and equitable so that all library customers will have an opportunity to use the collection.

All videos will be checked out for home use only, unless the videocassette has group showing rights. A disregard for this rule may be an infringement of copyright which could result in criminal prosecution against the borrower.

Library customers will be responsible for the videocassettes charged to their library card numbers.

Library customers are requested to report videocassette damage and not attempt to repair videocassettes themselves. The Regional Library System will not assume responsibility for any charges incurred by a library customer attempting to repair a videocassette or ordering the repair of a video cassette at a commercial establishment.

It is the responsibility of parents to guide the reading and viewing of their own children. Parents are encouraged to preview videos before they are viewed by their own children.

The Regional Library System will not be responsible for any damage caused to a borrower's video player while it is playing a video owned by the Regional Library System.
