SOQ Questions and Answers:

Question #1:

• Has anyone brought up that the Errors and Omissions Insurance requirement is excessive? \$3 million is way more than most architects will have.(or at least small firms that can do small jobs) (11/15/2018)

Question #2.: Reading Room (11/15/2018)

- A. Has there been an Asbestos report in the past? Could we get a copy? Yes, and Yes.
- B. Is the new floor covering to match adjacent materials or is there an opportunity for interior designer to make suggestions?
 We will want carpet squares to match the current level and quality that is in the north end of the main library.
- C. Beyond layout of furniture is there a need for help with furniture selection in the reading room? *No, no additional help is needed.*
- D. When providing reception and staff work space options is that furniture only or does it involve hard walls?
